Landowner Workshop – Dry Comal Creek Greenway Master Plan

New Braunfels, TX – The City of New Braunfels and the National Park Service invite you to the final community meeting regarding the Dry Comal Creek Greenway Master Plan. The workshop will be held on Wednesday, July 10, 2019 at the Columbus Club (111 Landa Street) from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.

The meeting will include presentations by the Texas Hill Country Alliance and the San Marcos Greenbelt Alliance and anyone who owns property on or near the Dry Comal Creek is encouraged to attend. Landowners will be provided with an opportunity to learn about the land conservation tools available to them in Texas and the successes of other land conservation partnerships in neighboring communities.

The City's 2010 Hike and Bike Trail envisioned extending the Dry Comal Creek Nature Trail to the north (toward town) and to the south (near Solms Park) along the floodplain of the Dry Comal Creek. The approximate proposed trail length is five miles.

In late 2017, The City of New Braunfels was awarded a technical assistance grant, from the National Park Service – Rivers, Trails and Conservation Assistance Program, to help develop a Master Plan for the Dry Comal Creek Nature Trail. Linear greenway park systems such as this can be created to protect the natural waterways, riparian corridors, natural and cultural resources and sensitive habitat lands. These greenways can also serve as flood and stormwater protection and provide compatible recreational opportunities that do not impact sensitive resources and private property rights.

“If you are interested in greenways, trails, water quality, waterway protection or live on or near the Dry Comal Creek plan to attend the workshop to learn more and also share your thoughts,” said Park Development Manager Ylda Capriccioso.
