## COLD CASE - Missing Person - Ann Marie Newark

New Braunfels, Texas — The New Braunfels Police Department continues to seek information from the public following the disappearance of Ann Marie Newark.

On Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>, 2013, the 53-year old Newark went missing in the FM 1044/Morningside Drive area of New Braunfels. Following a brief argument with family members, Newark left her home (in the 2700 block of Maple Tree Drive) on foot, leaving behind her purse, clothing, and medication. The only item she reportedly took with her was a 9-millimeter Glock handgun.

The last contact she had with family members was through a text message to her adult children the day she went missing, and there has been no contact since. In the nearly 2 years since her disappearance there has been no financial activity on Newark's bank and credit card accounts.

Newark is described as 5-foot 2-inches tall, weighing about 160-pounds. She has blonde, shoulder length hair, hazel eyes, and a scar on her neck.
