Library Guest Speaker Brings Tales of Ireland

New Braunfels, TX — The rolling, green hills and lush landscape of the Emerald Isle may seem even more out of reach than usual considering the recent weather in New Braunfels, but Irish native Cathleen Seba will bring it a little closer—if only for an hour.

On Wednesday, March 13, from 7 to 8 p.m. Seba will give a presentation on Irish culture and history, focusing on the Druids, St. Patrick and his mission, celebrations on both sides of the Atlantic and the immigrant story to America.

“I am excited to have Cathleen Seba present on Irish history and culture; there have been so many questions recently on this topic,” said Adult Services Librarian Jodi Brown. “Cathleen is a native of Ireland and is truly a wealth of knowledge.”

Seba was born and raised in Ireland. She attended college in Ireland, obtaining a degree in geography/history/archaeology. She worked with a geophysical company in Houston, mapping onshore and offshore for oil companies, and then lived in Mexico and Ireland before returning to the U.S. and to New Braunfels.

She went to Texas State University and received her teaching certificate in social studies while working with a mapping company for the oil industry. Seba is retired today but said now she wants to get people interested in stories about Ireland.
